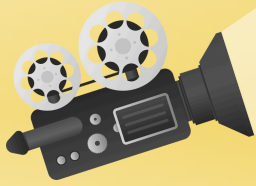

### Movie Synopsis

Slumdog Millionaire is about Jamal, a young man from the slums of Mumbai. He goes on the TV quiz show "Who Wants to Be a Millionaire?" and surprises everyone by answering all the questions correctly. The police think he cheated, so Jamal tells the story of his life to prove his innocence. Each question is linked to his past experiences, including his struggles with poverty, his brother Salim, and his love for Latika. In the end, Jamal wins the prize and reunites with Latika, showing that determination and love can lead to great achievements.

## Today's Expressions

1. Please give a big round of applause. 박수 갈채를 보내다

**Prem:** Please give a big round of applause to use our very first contestnat of the night . 오늘 밤 우리 쇼의 첫 도전자에게 큰 박수를 보내주십시오.

- **Explanation:** To clap loudly and cheer for someone to show appreciation or approval.
- **When to use:** Use this when you want to encourage people to clap for someone, like after a performance or speech.
- **Similar expressions:**
  - shower with applause
  - give a standing ovation
  - boo
  - criticize / hurl
- Examples:
  - The audience showered the performers with applause after their incredible performance.
  - The crowd gave the speaker a standing ovation for her inspiring speech.
  - The fans started to boo when the referee made a bad call.
  - The public hurled criticism at the politician for his recent statements.

2. Get a move on 빨리 움직여. 나와. 서둘러.

**Prakash:** This is borderline, kid. **Get a move on.**

- **Explanation:** To hurry up or go faster.
- **When to use:** Use this when you want someone to go faster or not waste time.
- **Similar expressions:**
  - Chop-chop!
  - Move aside.
  - get a say 의견을 낼 기회를 얻다, 의견을 내다
  - get a grip 진정하다, 침착해지다, 자신을 통제하다
  - get a life 더 흥미롭고 의미 있는 일을 하다, 제대로 된 삶을 살다
  - get a kick out of ~을 즐기다, 재미를 느끼다
- Examples:
  - Move aside, and I'll see if I can fix the problem.
  - Chop-chop! We can't be late.
  - In our book club, each member gets a say in selecting the next book to read.
  - You need to get a grip and stop panicking.
  - Stop playing video games all day and get a life!
  - I always get a kick out of watching old comedies.

3. pack it in. 그만해.

**Slaim:** Comone, **pack it in.**

- **Explanation:** To stop doing something, usually because it's not working or you're tired.
- **When to use:** Use this when you want to suggest stopping an activity.
- **Similar expressions:**

- Call it a day
- Wrap it up
- Examples:
  - We've been working on this all morning. Let's call it a day
  - Let's wrap it up for today and continue tomorrow.

4. **On your knees!** 무릎 꿇어!

**Slim:** **On your kneews!** Down!

- **Explanation:** To kneel down, often as a sign of respect, submission, or to be closer to the ground.
- **When to use:** Use this when you need someone to kneel for a specific reason.
- **Similar expressions:**
  - Get down on your knees. / Kneel down
  - Put your hands up (above your head). 손 (머리 위로) 들어.
  - bedn over. 허리 숙여.

5. I know **what you've been through.** 뭘 겪고 있는지 잘 알아요.

**Prem:** Me. I know what it feels like. I know what you've been through.

- **Explanation:** The experiences, often difficult or challenging, that someone has faced.
- **When to use:** Use this when talking about someone's past challenges or hardships.
- **Similar expressions:**
  - I know what you're going through.
  - You must have had a rough time
  - I know how you feel.
  - I've gone through that myself.
  - I can relate; I've been through something similar.
