2. 버스를 타다

: take a bus / catch a bus / get on the bus 차이

- "Take a bus" is about using the bus as transportation.
- "Catch a bus" implies urgency or the need to be on time to board the bus.
- "Get on the bus" refers to the physical action of entering the bus.

3. 헷갈리는 요금 단어 완벽이해! **Fare vs. Fee vs. Charge vs. Rate**

- 사용 범위:
 - **Fare** is exclusively used for transportation costs.
 - **Fee** is used for specific services or rights.
 - **Charge** is a broad term that can cover any cost imposed for goods or services.
 - **Rate** is used for services that are billed by time or amount used, such as electricity or hotel stays.
- Context:
 - **Fare**: Travel-related (e.g., bus fare, train fare).
 - **Fee**: Service-related (e.g., membership fee, tuition fee).
 - **Charge**: General expenses (e.g., bank charges, service charges).
 - **Rate**: Price per unit/time for services. (e.g., electricity, hotel stays)
- Examples in Context
 - Bus **Fare**: "I need to save some money for the bus fare."
 - Membership **Fee**: "The gym membership fee is due at the end of the month."
 - Service **Charge**: "The restaurant added a service charge to our bill."
 - The hotel room **rate** is \$150 per night
