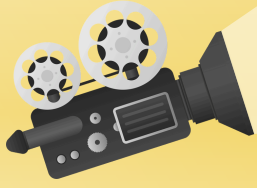

Movie Synopsis

On the Basis of Sex is a movie about Ruth Bader Ginsburg, a young lawyer who wants to make the world fair for everyone, especially women. The movie shows how she works hard to change a law that treats men and women differently. Ruth believes that everyone should have the same rights, no matter if they are a man or a woman. Even though she faces many challenges, she doesn't give up. Her work helps make important changes in the law so that everyone can be treated equally.

Today's Expressions

1. **shouldn't have done.. ~하지 말았어야 했어.**

Martin: I shouldn't have taken the job.

- **Explanation:** This phrase is used to express regret or criticize a past action, indicating that it was a mistake or wrong.
- Examples
 - We **should've left** the house sooner; now we're going to be late.
우리가 더 일찍 집을 나섰어야 했어. 이제 늦겠어.
 - You **should've seen** that movie; it was amazing!
그 영화를 봐야 했어; 정말 대단했어!
 - I **shouldn't have eaten** so much cake; now I feel sick.
케이크를 너무 많이 먹지 말았어야 했어; 이제 속이 안 좋아.
 - We **shouldn't have trusted** him so easily
그를 그렇게 쉽게 믿지 말았어야 했어.

2. **take something out on somebody ~에게 화풀이하다**

Bennett: Hey, hey, hey! Don't take it out on me.

- **Explanation:** This phrase means to treat someone badly because you are upset or angry, even if they have done nothing wrong
- **Similar expressions:**
 - take on
 - take years off someone
 - take turns
- Examples:
 - I know you're stressed, but don't **take it out on** me.
네가 스트레스를 받고 있는 건 알지만, 나한테 화풀이하지 마.
 - She **took** too much **on** and made herself ill.
그녀는 너무 많은 일을 떠맡아서 몸이 아팠어.
 - Her voice **took on** a troubled tone.
그녀의 목소리는 걱정스러운 톤을 띠었어.
 - "Have you seen James without his beard?" "I know - it **takes years off** him!"
"제임스가 수염 없이 어떻게 생겼는지 봤어?" "그러니까 - 훨씬 젊어 보이더라!"
 - You can't both play with the truck at the same time - **take turns**.
둘이서 동시에 그 트럭을 가지고 놀 순 없어 - 번갈아가면서 해.

3. **We should get going 가봐야 해요**

Ruth: We should get going.

- **Explanation:** This phrase is used to suggest that it's time to leave or start moving towards a destination.
- **Similar expressions:**
 - We should head out.
 - We better get moving.
 - Let's get out of here.

- It's time to hit the road.
- Examples:
 - We **should get going** if we want to catch the bus.
버스를 타려면 이제 출발해야 해.
 - The movie starts in 20 minutes. We **should head out** if we don't want to miss the beginning.
영화가 20분 후에 시작해. 시작 부분을 놓치고 싶지 않으면 이제 나가야 해.
 - Traffic is going to be bad if we wait too long. **We better get moving** before rush hour hits.
너무 오래 기다리면 교통이 혼잡해질 거야. 러시아워 전에 움직이는 게 좋겠어.
 - This party is getting boring. **Let's get out of here** and grab some coffee instead.
이 파티가 점점 지루해지고 있어. 여기서 나가서 커피나 마시자.
 - We've finished packing, and the car is ready. It's time to hit the road if we want to reach Grandma's house before dark.
짐도 다 싸고 차도 준비됐어. 할머니 댁에 어두워지기 전에 도착하려면 이제 출발해야 해.

4. brush-off 싹 무시함

Ruth: But all the little **brush-offs**, the dismissive pats on the head... It matter, Marty.

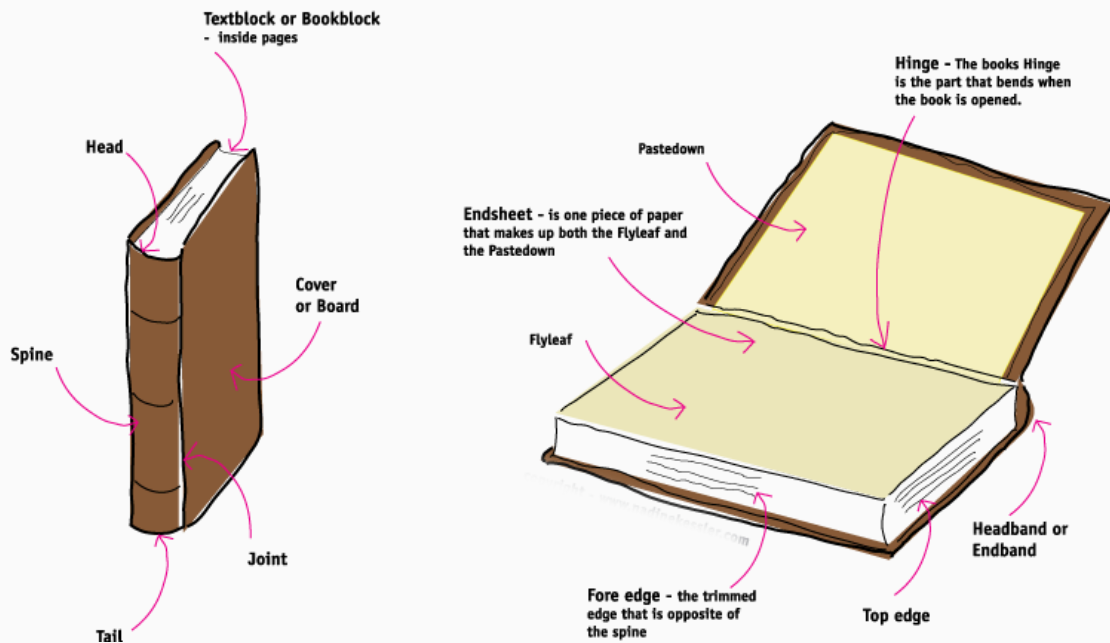
- **Explanation:** This phrase refers to dismissing someone or something as unimportant or not worth your time.
- **Similar expressions:**
 - give someone the brush-off
 - brush off someone/something
 - Blow off
 - ghost someone
 - snub
- Examples:
 - I tried to talk to him after class, but he **gave me the brush-off** and walked away without saying much.
수업 끝나고 그에게 말을 걸었는데, 나를 무시하고 별 말 없이 가버렸어.
 - I tried to give him advice, but he just **brushed it off** like it didn't matter.
그에게 조언을 해주려고 했지만, 그는 그것을 대수롭지 않게 무시했어.
 - We were supposed to meet for lunch, but she totally **blew me off** and never showed up
점심 약속이 있었는데, 그녀가 아예 무시하고 나타나지 않았어.
 - I thought we were getting along, but then she just **ghosted me**.
우린 잘 지내고 있다고 생각했는데, 그녀가 갑자기 연락을 끊었어.
 - She **snubbed** me at the party, acting like she didn't even know me.
그녀는 파티에서 나를 아는 척도 안 하며 무시했어.

5. page-turner (책장 넘기기가 바쁠 정도로) 흥미진진한 책

Ruth: Sounds like a real page-turner.

- **Explanation:** This phrase describes a book that is very interesting or exciting, making you want to keep reading it.

- **Gripping** 마음을 사로잡는

The story was so **gripping**, I couldn't put it down.

- **Captivating** 마음을 사로잡는

Her novel is **captivating** from start to finish.

- **Compelling** 강렬한, 설득력 있는, 눈을 땔 수가 없는

The characters were so well-written; the story was truly **compelling**.

- **Unputdownable** (너무 재미있어서) 손에서 놓을 수가 없는

The mystery was so intense; it was absolutely **unputdownable**.

- **Cliffhanger** 손에 땀을 쥐게 하는 상황

The book ended with a **cliffhanger**, and now I can't wait for the sequel!

- **Slow-Paced** 느릿느릿한, 느린 전개

The plot was interesting, but the story was **slow-paced**.

- **Predictable** (일·행동 등이 재미없을 정도로) 너무 뻔한

The ending was so **predictable**, I saw it coming from the start.

- **Tedious** 지루한, 싫증나는, 따분한

Reading this book was **tedious**, and I struggled to finish it.

- **Overrated** 과대 평가된

Everyone loved it, but I found it **overrated**.

1. Spit it out

Kenyon: Well, spit it out.

- **Explanation:** This phrase is used to urge someone to say something they are hesitating to say, usually because they are nervous or unsure.
- **Similar expressions:**
 - Say it
 - Get it out
 - Speak up
- Examples:
 - You've been quiet all evening. If something's bothering you, just spit it out!
너 오늘 저녁 내내 조용하네. 뭔가 마음에 걸리는 게 있으면 그냥 말해봐!
 - I know you have something on your mind. Just say it.
네가 무슨 생각이 있는지 알아. 그냥 말해봐.
 - You've been holding onto that secret for too long. It's time to get it out and share with us.
네가 그 비밀을 너무 오래 간직했어. 이제 털어놓고 우리랑 나눠봐.
 - If you have an idea for the project, don't be shy—speak up and let everyone
